

Il corso riguarderà quindi: principi e regole riguardanti l'arbitrabilità delle controversie; la rilevanza della sede arbitrale; la convenzione arbitrale; poteri e doveri del tribunale arbitrale; le fasi procedurali dalla domanda di arbitrato al lodo definitivo, compresa l'assunzione delle prove, l'arbitrato con pluralità di parti, la scelta delle norme applicabili al merito della controversia, i lodi provvisori e parziali, o d'emergenza, ecc.; le differenze tra arbitrato nazionale e internazionale; riconoscimento ed esecuzione dei lodi arbitrali stranieri e Convenzione di New York del 1958.</p> <p>Il corso non richiede alcuna conoscenza preliminare ed è dunque accessibile, altresì, a studenti Erasmus/stranieri.</p>

COURSE STRUCTURE

Frontal lessons; study seminars; analysis of case law.

The course aims at giving introductory notions on international arbitration. The course will thus encompass: principles and rules regarding arbitrability of disputes; the relevance of the arbitration seat; arbitration agreements; powers and duties of the arbitral tribunal; all procedural stages since the request for arbitration to the final award, including taking of evidence, multiparty arbitration, choice of rules applicable to the merits of the dispute, final, interim and partial award, etc.; differences between domestic and international arbitration; recognition and enforcement of foreign arbitral awards and the New York 1958 Convention.

The course will combine frontal lessons and seminars with active participation and teamwork by students and, desirably, practical sessions of written and oral legal advocacy, mock cases, etc.

The final examination will consist in an overall assessment of each student performance throughout the entire duration of the course.

DETAILED COURSE CONTENT

1. International Commercial Arbitration: Historical Evolution; Main Concepts. Sources of Discipline; 2. Administered and ad hoc arbitration. Seat of Arbitration. Differences Between Domestic and International Arbitration; 3. Arbitrability. The Arbitration Agreement; 4. The Law Applicable to the Merits of the Dispute; 5. Selection, Powers and Duties of the Arbitrator; 6.-7. Procedural and Evidential Matters in International Arbitration; 8. Challenges to Arbitral Awards; 9. Recognition and Enforcement of Foreign Arbitral Awards. The New York 1958 Convention. Inklings on Investment Arbitration.
